<p><i>Campsis radicans</i> ‘Balboa Sunset’ Trumpet Vine</p>	<p>Tubular deep reddish orange flowers. Vigorous clinging vine thrives and blooms profusely without much effort. Deciduous.</p>	<p>H 20-30’ W Varies Zone 4+</p>	
<p>Clematis Diamond Ball</p>	<p>Cool white-blue flowers that are round and semi-spherical in shape. Long bloomer</p>	<p>H 60-72” W 24-36” Zone 4+</p>	
<p>Clematis <i>jackmanii</i> ‘Superba’</p>	<p>Showy deep violet purple flowers will cover this climbing vine throughout most of summer.</p>	<p>H 10-12’ W Varies Zone 4+</p>	
<p>Clematis <i>jackmanii</i> ‘Jolly Good’</p>	<p>Copious light purple flowers with magenta undertones cover the vine all summer. Vigorous grower. Compact and perfect for training on fences or trellises</p>	<p>H 72-84” W 24-36” Zone 4+</p>	
<p>Clematis x ‘Multi-Blue’ Multi-Blue Clematis</p>	<p>Produces 4-5” long lasting blue flowers with spikey thistle-like centers. Blooms in early summer and re-blooms in late summer to late fall. Fragrant and deer resistant.</p>	<p>H 6-8’ W 3’ Zone 3</p>

Clematis Sapphire Indigo	A Clematis groundcover! This charming shrub-like groundcover grows with no support to form a 3' wide mound of arching stems. Just 4' in height if trained onto a short trellis. Single 4" dark purple blossoms open to reveal matching indigo-dyed anthers from June through September. No pruning necessary. Fabulous spilling out of a barrel or large container. A relative of The President.	H 4' W 3' Zone 4	
Clematis The President	Violet blue blooms arrive steadily for most of the summer. Consistently delivers a great show and is one of the best and most popular repeat bloomers since 1876. Award of Garden Merit. Superb companion with climbing roses. Pruning group 2. (late winter or early spring avoid heavy pruning).	H 6-10' W 4-6' Zone 4	
Clematis Viva Polonia	A new, easy growing clematis with large red flowers and a showy white center star. Blooms from early summer to mid summer. Perfect for covering anything.	H 48-72" W 24-36" Zone 4	
Hydrangea <i>anomala</i> <i>petiolaris</i> Climbing Hydrangea	Vigorous climbing vine that clings to surfaces by aerial rootlets. Slow growing, shrubby habit until established, then quite vigorous, producing long, fast growing stems. Lush green foliage is blanketed with magnificent, white lace cap blooms in summer. Deciduous.	H 30-80' W Varies Zone 4+	
Humulus <i>lupulus</i> 'Cascade' Cascade Hops	Vigorous perennial vine. Moderately bitter variety is one of the most popular hops for craft brewing. Dioecious (male and female plants separate). Easy-to-grow ornamental plant. Rough stems clad with lobed leaves. Yellow-green male flowers bloom in catkins. Flowers emit a pine-like fragrance and are attractive to butterflies. 4-6% bitterness.	H 10-20' W Varies Zone 3

<p><i>Humulus lupulus</i> 'Willamette' Willamette Hops</p>	<p>One of the best hops for pale ales, brown ales or UK style ales. Also used in teas for insomnia. The vines and fragrant flowers make a sensational statement in any landscape whether you use the hops to make beer or not. Grow on a fence, wall or trellis for support.</p>	<p>H 10-20' W Varies Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Lonicera x brownii</i> 'Dropmore Scarlet' Honeysuckle</p>	<p>Long blooming season (June-Sept.) of showy tubular flower clusters backed by attractive blue-green foliage. Handsome, dense vine for fences, arbors, even as a groundcover. Long lasting red berries follow the blooms. Deciduous.</p>	<p>H 8-10' W 3-5' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Lonicera sempervirens</i> 'Major Wheeler' Honeysuckle</p>	<p>This honeysuckle vine features coral-red trumpet-like flowers with golden insides surrounded by medium green foliage. Blooms appear from late spring to autumn. Best on a trellis, fence, railing, or stone wall.</p>	<p>H 6-10' W Varies Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Parthenocissus quinquefolia</i> var. <i>engelmannii</i> Engelman Ivy (syn Virginia Creeper)</p>	<p>Fast-growing vine that climbs or trails along the ground. The leaves are compound, containing five leaflets. Leaflets range from 2-6" in diameter and have toothed margins. Leaflets are red when they first emerge but turn green with maturity. In the fall, leaves turn a bright red to maroon color. Possible production of small berry fruit during early summer.</p>	<p>H Varies W Varies Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Polygonum fallopian aubertii</i> Silver Lace Vine</p>	<p>A vigorous drought tolerant vine capable of 12' growth in one year. Beautiful fragrant white flowers from summer to fall. Low maintenance.</p>	<p>Zone 4</p>

<p>Wisteria <i>macrostachya</i> 'Blue Moon'</p>	<p>Blooms in early summer, rests and starts again, sometimes blooms even a third time. No pruning required. Blooms best in full sun.</p>	<p>H 15-25 W Varies Zone 4</p>	
<p>Wisteria <i>macrostachya</i> 'Summer Cascade'</p>	<p>Flowers bloom on long showy racemes and open a lovely shade of dark lavender before fading. Flowering vine that can easily cover an arbor or pergola.</p>	<p>H 15-20' W Varies Zone 4</p>
