


<u>Climbing Roses</u>			
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Climbing America™'</b> Large-flowered Climbing Rose</p>	<p>Large coral-pink flowers of densely overlapping petals paired with an intense, spicy fragrance. 4-5" cupped blooms occur individually, and in small clusters, on wood, new and old. A vigorous and free-flowering plant with dark green foliage. This climbing rose is one of the few, of this type, to achieve AARS award-winning status.</p>	<p>H 8-10' W 4-6' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Climbing Don Juan'</b> Climbing Rose</p>	<p>Ruffled, velvety dark-red blossoms. These cupped, double flowers measure 5" across and emit a powerful fragrance. Bloom from summer into fall. Glossy dark-green foliage with a leathery texture. A well renowned climber, sure to please.</p>	<p>H 6-10' W 3-6' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa hybrida</i> <b>'Climbing John Cabot'</b></p>	<p>Bears an abundance of fragrant blooms from early summer until frost, in a gamut of shades from orchid pink to fuchsia red. Complemented by lustrous soft green foliage along the vigorous canes, the lovely flowers are followed by attractive hips of orange. Own root.</p>	<p>H 5-9' W 6-8' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Rosa hybrida</i> <b>'Climbing John Davis'</b></p>	<p>An exceptional climbing rose with fragrant, double pink flowers. Blooms all season and is great for arbors and fences.</p>	<p>H 5-6' W 5-6' Zone 2</p>

<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Climbing Ramblin Red'</b></p>	<p>A vigorous, climbing rose with dense clusters of semi-double 3 to 4" wide, true red blooms. Slightly fragrant and re-blooming from late spring to early fall. Foliage shows a touch of red turning to dark green. Hardy and disease resistant.</p>	<p>H 8-10' W 2-4' Zone 2</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Climbing Royal Gold'</b> Large-flowered Climbing Rose</p>	<p>Daffodil-yellow 4-5" cupped blooms with a moderately sweet honey fragrance. Free-flowering, borne individually or in clusters of 3-7. Large, glossy dark-green foliage. Long stems make these suitable for cuttings.</p>	<p>H 5-7' W 5' Zone 4</p>	
<p><u>Floribunda/Grandiflora Roses</u></p>			
<p><i>Rosa floribunda</i> <b>'Ketchup and Mustard™'</b> Floribunda Rose</p>	<p>Eye-catching combination of bright red and mustard yellow in reverse on velvety, double blooms. Long-lasting color. Glossy green foliage. Mildly fragrant. Plant in full sun and moist, well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 4' W 3' Zone 6</p>	

<u>Tea Roses</u>			
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Blue Girl'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>An exhibition-form silvery lilac lavender rose. Large deep-green foliage, bushy habit, vigorous growth. It has a moderately fruity fragrance. Performs very well and is very disease resistant. Blooms in spring and fall.</p>	<p>H 3-5' W 4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Broadway'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Blooms are exhibition-form and a gradient of golden-yellow petals to soft magenta margins. Color will deepen with sun light. High flower centers make these ideal for cutting. Provides a strong spice and damask fragrance. Upright and vigorous habit.</p>	<p>H 4' W 3-4' Zone 5</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Dolly Parton'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Bright and curvaceous. These very large, high-centered, enduring blossoms are a glowing orangey-red. Emanates an intense clove and rose fragrance. Broad, upright habit with large semi-glossy medium-green foliage.</p>	<p>H 3-5' W 4' Zone 4</p>	

<p><i>Rosa floribunda</i> <b>'Ebb Tide'</b> Floribunda Rose (Bushy)</p>	<p>Dusky, deep purple 4" old-fashioned double-petal blooms with a velvet plum wash. Intense citrus and clove fragrance. Bush, upright habit, deep-green glossy foliage.</p>	<p>H 4' W 4' Zone 6</p>	
<p><i>Rosa grandiflora</i> <b>'Gold Medal'</b> Grandiflora Rose (Bushy)</p>	<p>Plump pointed buds on this bush open to 4.5-5" blooms of deep golden-yellow with blushed orange-red tips. Releases a light fruity fragrance. Large dark green foliage and an upright, vigorous habit. Performs well in the heat. Disease resistant. Plant in full sun and moist, well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 5-6' W 4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa floribunda</i> <b>'Intrigue'</b> Floribunda Rose (Bushy)</p>	<p>Unique dark wine-colored buds on long elegant stems open to 3" high-centered plum-purple blooms. An intense lemon fragrance wafts from these beautiful roses. Upright, bushy habit.</p>	<p>H 3-4' W 2-3' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Julie Andrews'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Bears masses of intense pink-fuchsia blooms with a bright yellow heart. 4-5" double blooms radiate a robust perfume of anise, rose, and tarragon. Dark green foliage, upright and bushy habit. Selected as "Most Beautiful Rose of the Century" at the International New Rose Competition.</p>	<p>H 2-4' W 3' Zone 5</p>	

<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Peace'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Large, up to 6" across, creamy yellow cupped flowers with pink flush from the slightly ruffled edges. Light fruity fragrance. Glossy very dark-green foliage, and very vigorous, bushy, upright habit. An iconic rose with long stems.</p>	<p>H 4-7' W 2-3' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Pink Peace'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Deep pink cupped 4.5-6" blooms upon long stems accompanied by an intense rose fragrance. Leathery matte green foliage. Bushy, upright, and vigorous habit. Makes a great cut flower.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 3-4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Pope John Paul II'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Most fragrant white rose of all time. Large, luminous, pure-white blossoms lavishly petaled against dark green foliage. Vigorous growth, bushy full habit, and disease resistant. Plant in full sun and moist, well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 3-4' Zone 5</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Proud Land'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Large, deep-red high-centered blooms. Moderately fragrant blooms from summer into fall. Leathery, dark-green leaves last from spring to fall. Vigorous, upright habit.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 3-4' Zone 4</p>	

<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Red Masterpiece'</b> Hybrid Tea Rose</p>	<p>Exceptionally huge, reaching up to 8" across, intensely fragrant, crimson red blooms. Large dark-green leathery foliage. Upright, vigorous habit. Heirloom. The red rose to impress.</p>	<p>H 3-4' W 3-4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa hybrida</i> <b>'BOZFRA221'</b> <b>REMINISCENT®</b> Coral Hybrid Rose</p>	<p>A hybrid combining the look and fragrance of old-fashioned roses with the advantages of modern-day plant performance. Elegant bowl-shaped double flowers of coral-pink and slight hues of copper in the center. Very fragrant. Dark-green serrated foliage, upright habit. Disease resistant. <p><i>Rosa hybrida</i> <b>'BOZFRA021'</b> <b>REMINISCENT®</b> Pink Hybrid Rose</p>	<p>A hybrid combining the look and fragrance of old-fashioned roses with the advantages of modern-day plant performance. Perfectly shaped, high petal count, light-pink double flowers. Very fragrant, perfect for planting near outdoor sitting areas. Dark-green serrated foliage, upright habit. Disease resistant. <p><u>Shrub Roses</u></p>			
<p><i>Rosa foetida bicolor</i> <b>'Austrian Copper'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>One of the most dazzling displays among roses. The long, upright canes are ablaze with color as yellow buds, brushed with red, open to blooms of copper-red with a brilliant yellow reverse, intensified further by bright yellow stamens and a strong scent. Budded.</p>	<p>H 6-8' W 8-10' Zone 4</p>	

<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Bonica®'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>Large clusters of 2.5" candy-pink double blooms on arching branches over mild green foliage. Continual bloomer, is disease resistant. Plant in full sun to partial shade. Likes to grow in sufficiently moist, well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Gourmet Popcorn'</b> Miniature Rose (shrub form)</p>	<p>Pure white, full buds in cascading clusters open to reveal yellow centers. Clean, dark green foliage. Very hardy and disease resistant. Plant in full sun and sufficiently moist, well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 2' W 2' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Iceberg'</b> Floribunda Rose (shrub form)</p>	<p>One of the top ten roses in the world. Iceberg is extremely disease-resistant and a vigorous grower. Long, pointed buds and crisp white flowers bud with the least of care. Dark green foliage. Plant in full sun although shade tolerant, likes reasonably moist soil.</p>	<p>H 3-5' W 2' Zone 5</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Miracle on the Hudson®'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>Large semi-double red blossoms, up to 4", with mild fragrance, group in clusters. New growth foliage begins as red, maturing to dark green. Bushy, compact, and rounded habit. Exceptional resistance to black spot and powdery mildew.</p>	<p>H 3-4' W 3-4' Zone 3</p>	

<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Morden Sunrise'</b> <b>PP13969</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>This Parkland series rose has dark foliage with much improved resistance to blackspot. The creamy orange-yellow buds open to fragrant flowers with wavy petals and orange stamens. As they age, the color matures from dark orange over yellow, to light orange with bright yellow, to creamy yellow with white. Own root. Budded.</p>	<p>H 2-3' W 2-3' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Outta the Blue™'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>Many blue hues, rich magenta spiked with yellow, burgundy sparked with cream, warm lavender spilling to nearly blue. Free-flowering and very vigorous, bears big clusters of old-fashioned formed flowers. Hardy, ever-changing colors for all climates.</p>	<p>H 3-4' W 3-4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa foetida persiana</i> <b>'Persian Yellow'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>This rose provides a burst of early color with brilliant golden-yellow flowers. Strong licorice scent.</p>	<p>H 6' W 4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Rosa</i> <b>'Robusta Red'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>Eye-catching single red 4" blooms in clusters produced in abundance on a vigorous, continually blooming upright bush with beautiful, medium-green, glossy foliage.</p>	<p>H 5-6' W 5-6' Zone 4</p>	

<p><i>Rosa hybrida</i> <b>'Winnipeg Parks'</b> Shrub Rose</p>	<p>The pointed buds of this Parkland rose are borne in small clusters of deep pinkish-red and open to dark cherry-pink flowers with a dark pink reverse. The slightly fragrant flowers age to dark pink backed by matte green foliage that takes on a reddish tinge in fall. With a bonus of red hips, this compact, low-growing rose is a beauty. Own root.</p>	<p>H 2-3' W 2-3' Zone 3</p>
