Deer and rabbit resistant, toxic to cats, dogs, and horses. Full sun. Dry to medium moisture soils that drain well, drought resistant.	H 12-14" W 14-16" Zone 4	
<i>Achillea millefolium</i> <b>NEW VINTAGE™</b> <b>'Violet'</b> <b>PP25750</b> Yarrow	Features striking violet flowers with excellent re-bloom. <i>Achillea millefolium</i> <b>NEW VINTAGE™</b> <b>'White'</b> <b>PP25711</b> Yarrow	Uniform and compact habit of bright white flower clusters over lacy green leaves. Blooms in the early summer and reblooms in the late summer. Likes full sun and dry to medium moisture soils that are well-drained. Not preferred by deer and rabbits, attracts butterflies. <i>Achillea millefolium</i> <b>'Paprika'</b> Yarrow	Blooms large clusters of bright red flowers surrounding a yellow eye. Matures to pink, creating beautiful multi-colored effect. Drought tolerant.	H 30" W 30" Zone 3	
<i>Achillea millefolium</i> <b>'Pomegranate'</b> Yarrow	Long-lasting cherry red, flat-top clusters of flowers. Green, fern-like foliage is disease resistant. Blooms early to late summer. Drought, heat, deer, and rabbit tolerant. Attracts butterflies.	H 1-2' W 1-2' Zone 3

<i>Aegopodium podagraria</i> <b>'Variegatum'</b> Snow on the Mountain or Bishop's Goutweed	Dense canopy of green variegated foliage. Small white flowers are produced in midsummer upon leafy stems up to three feet tall. Full sun to part shade. Average soil requirements.	H 8-24" W 12-72" Zone 4	
<i>Alcea</i> <b>'Las Vegas'</b> Fig Leaf Hollyhock	Large concave flowers in showy colors of copper, chestnut brown, pink, red, white, and yellow. Large fig leaf foliage ordains entire length of the stalk. Hardy and longer lived than other varieties. Blooms in early summer. Full sun.	H 5-6' W 18-24" Zone 3	
<i>Alcea rosea</i> <b>'Fiesta Time'</b> Hollyhock	Cerise-pink double flowers with soft pink edges. This compact variety will flower in the first year and is suitable for small gardens and container planting. Plant in full sun. Blooms in midsummer.	H 3' W 18-24" Zone 3	
<i>Alcea rosea</i> <b>'Mars Magic'</b> Hollyhock	Bright red saucer-shaped single flowers populate the upper portion of the stalk, with green lobbed leaves below. This perennial needs full sun. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and pollinators.	H 5-6' W 18-24" Zone 3	
<i>Allium</i> <b>'Lavender Bubbles'</b> Ornamental Onion	This allium features dark, dusty purple flowers shaped like globes. Glossy green-blue foliage cluster nicely below the flowers. As the blades grow, they tend to curl, adding dimension to this unique variety. Likes full sun or partial shade, low to average water needs. Compatible with containers. <i>Allium</i> <b>'Medusa'</b> Ornamental Onion	Green stems hold buds with a snake-head appearance above a starburst of grey-green twisty leaf blades. In late summer to early fall, buds bloom into light amethyst purple pompom flowers. Full sun to partial sun. Fragrant. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and pollinators. <i>Anemone</i> <b>'Dainty Swan'</b> Windflower	Large, white flowers with bright pink backs. Flowers throughout summer and nod in evening to early morning to expose colored backings. Full sun to partial shade. Likes moist, but well-drained soil.	H 22" W 1-2' Zone 4	
<i>Anemone</i> <b>'Dreaming Swan'</b> Windflower	A choice perennial for summer and fall gardens. Semi-double flowers begin bloom as off-white pink and mature to white with purple backing. Blooms in the late spring until frost in the fall. Prefers mixed lighting and moist soils.	H 2' W 23-25" Zone 4	
<i>Aquilegia</i> <b>KIRIGAMI™</b> <b>Deep Blue &amp; White</b> Columbine	Thin, green upright stems support upward-facing flowers of dark indigo blue and white shades. Blooms in late spring to early summer. Suitable for containers. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and pollinators.	H 22-24" W 16-20" Zone 4	
<i>Arctostaphylos uva-ursi</i> <b>'Massachusetts'</b> Kinnikinnick/Bearberry	Very cold-hardy groundcover. Clusters of 2-inch, bell-shaped, pink flowers grow off spreading foliage. Red berries follow the blooms that last into winter. In the fall, foliage changes to a red-gold tint. Needs partial to full sun.	H 12" W 10-15" Zone 2	
<i>Artemisia schmidtiana</i> <b>'Silver Mound'</b> Silver Mound Artemisia	Soft, feathery, silver leaves grow into compact, cushiony mounds. Thrives in full sun. Average, well-drained soil.	H 8-10" W 10-15" Zone 3	
<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i> <b>Orange Butterfly Plant</b>	A hassle-free perennial with three months of tangerine orange blooms followed by green fruits filled with silvery-white, silky seeds. Excellent long-lasting cut flower. Breaks dormancy late. High drought tolerance. Full sun. Average, dry to medium, well-drained soils.	H 18-24" W 12-18" Zone 3	
<i>Aster novae-angliae</i> <b>'Grape Crush'</b> New England Aster	Large, round mound of densely packed rich purple flowers above dark green foliage. Suitable for container planting. Blooms early to mid-fall.	H 26-30" W 40-44" Zone 3

<i>Astilbe japonica</i> <b>Younique™ 'White'</b>	Fragrant, triangular shaped, ivory white plumes rising above mound of serrated green foliage. Prefers moist soils in partial shade. Versatile, used in gardens, containers, and cut floral arrangements.	H 12-16" W 14-18" Zone 3	
<i>Aubrieta</i> <b>'Audrey Deep Purple'</b> Rock Cress	Compact, mat-forming, evergreen perennial with small gray-green leaves and short racemes of four-petal, deep purple-blue flowers in spring. Full sun but will tolerate part shade. Prefers rocky, sandy, dry spots.	H 3-6" W 12-14" Zone 4	
<i>Aubrieta</i> <b>AXCENT™</b> <b>'Burgundy'</b> Rock Cress	Dense, soft grey-green foliage with mounding habit. Burgundy flowers bloom in mid to late spring. Likes full or partial sun, low water requirements once established, but average while blooming.	H 4-6" W 10-12" Zone 4	
<i>Baptisia hybrida</i> <b>'American Goldfinch'</b> False Indigo	Very floriferous, producing loads of brightly colored spikes for many weeks. Produces round seed pods in the fall. Requires minimal maintenance. Deer resistant. Full sun to part shade. Average soil.	H 36-42" W 54-60" Zone 4	
<i>Baptisia</i> <b>'Grape Taffy'</b> False Indigo	Naturally compact size. Spike of deep reddish-purple flowers appear in early summer accented by a buff yellow keel. Attractive green foliage.	H 24-30" W 24-30" Zone 4

<i>Baptisia</i> <b>'Indigo Spires'</b> False Indigo	Long spikes of deep purple flowers with yellow keel populate all sides of the rounded habit. Densely branched, green foliage extends down the stem to the base. Blooms occur in early summer, but secondary blooms extend into midsummer. Easy to grow, low maintenance, and long-lived. Likes full or partial sun, low to average water needs.	H 42-48" W 42" Zone 4	
<i>Baptisia</i> <b>'Royal Purple'</b> False Indigo	Dark violet-purple blooms saturated with color. Dramatic flower spikes with appealing visual display. Full sun.	H 3-4' W 3-4' Zone 4	
<i>Baptisia</i> <b>'Sparkling Sapphires'</b> False Indigo	Vivid blue flowers appear atop the compact clump of green-blue foliage. Blooms in the spring. Part sun to full sun. Easy to maintain. Smaller in size, perfect for urban landscapes.	H 30-36" W 30-36" Zone 4	
<i>Baptisia</i> <b>'TWILITE PRAIRIEBLUES™'</b> False Indigo	Deep purple buds open to smokey violet flowers with lemon yellow keels. Long-lasting flowers appear on upright spikes from late spring to early summer.	H 42-60" W 4-5' Zone 4	
<i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> <b>'Winter Glow'</b> Bergenia	Clump-forming perennial that is primarily grown as a ground cover. Features large rosettes of leathery, glossy, rounded, dark green leaves that are heart-shaped at the base. Reddish fall and winter foliage color. Part shade to full shade. Prefers average, medium well-drained soils.	H 12-18" W 12-18" Zone 4

<i>Brunnera macrophylla</i> <b>'Jack Frost'</b> False Forget-Me-Not	Large green, silver coated, heart-shaped foliage. Light-blue flowers in the spring. Thrives in part shade to shade and normal soil. Award winner.	H 12-16" W 12-16" Zone 2	
<i>Callirhoe involucrata</i> <b>Wine Cups</b> Wildflower	Native, long blooming, perennial useful for its blanketing behavior. Magenta cup flowers attract butterflies but are unfavored by deer. Ideal for retaining walls or borders where they can "spill". Blooms midspring to the fall.	H 6-12" W 6-36" Zone 4	
<i>Certastium tomentosum</i> <b>'Yo Yo'</b> Snow in Summer	Flowering is profuse, with blooms that are silvery white, and star shaped. Showy, silver grayish-green foliage creates an attractive ground cover. Does well in poor soil but needs full sun. Blooms late spring to early summer.	H 4-6" W 12-15" Zone 3	
<i>Coreopsis grandiflora</i> <b>'Early Sunrise'</b> Tickseed	Bold golden-yellow, semi-double flowers with orange-yellow centers upon thin upright stems. Narrow, dark green foliage arches out from the common base. Plant in full sun. Suitable for container gardening. Attracts butterflies and pollinators.	H 18" W 15-24" Zone 4	
<i>Coreopsis grandiflora</i> <b>'Double the Sun'</b> Tickseed	Big semi-double canary yellow flowers. Green lanceolate leaves form a mound at the plant base. Needs full sun, average water, but drought and heat tolerant once established.	H 12-14" W 12-14" Zone

<i>Coreopsis verticillata</i> <b>'Zagreb'</b> Threadleaf Coreopsis	Compact plant forming a gorgeous mound of finely divided leaves. Blooms continuously from early to late summer, covered in bright, golden yellow blossoms. Plant in full sun. Attracts butterflies and pollinators.	H 15" W 12-15" Zone 4	
<i>Chelone lyonii</i> <b>'Pink Temptation'</b> and <b>'Hot Lips'</b> Turtlehead	Shiny green leaves topped with pink turtle-shaped flowers in late summer and early fall. Adaptable to most types of soil that stay medium moist or wet. Attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Deer resistant.	H 12-18" W 12-18" Zone 3	
<i>Chrysanthemum</i> <b>'Campfire Glow'</b> Hardy Mum	Vibrant bi-color orange and red flower, blooms late in the season. Thrives in moist, well-drained soil, and full sun. A perfect way to add intense color to your garden as the season progresses into fall.	H 22-26" W 24" Zone 4	
<i>Chrysanthemum</i> <b>'Mammoth Red'</b> Daisy Mum	Bright red flowers with orange undertones and golden yellow centers bloom from late summer through fall. They rest on strong, dark green stems above foliage. Attracts butterflies. Full sun.	H 16-18" W 16-18" Zone 3	
<i>Chrysanthemum</i> <b>'Mammoth Lavender'</b> Daisy Mum	This rounded perennial features vibrant, lavender pink blooms in the late summer. Foliage is densely packed into a neat bundle of incredible color. Perfect for borders, landscape designs, and patio containers.	H 14" W 20" Zone 3

<i>Chrysanthemum</i> <b>'Mammoth Yellow Quill'</b> Daisy Mum	Semi-double, bright yellow flowers with unique spoon-shaped ray florets. Blooms late summer. Selected for their hardiness, vigor, and mammoth size.	H 14" W 20" Zone 3	
<i>Delphinium</i> <b>Delgenius™</b> <b>'Breezin'</b> Hybrid Delphinium	Compact and upright habit. A mound of frilly, dark-green leaves hosts many strong multi-branching stems with spires of dark-purple double flowers. Blooms in early summer into the fall. Attractive to butterflies, hummingbirds, and pollinators, not liked by deer. Likes full sun.	H 20-24" W 16-20" Zone 3	
<i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'Magic Fountains Dark Blue with White Bee'</b> Delphinium	Intense, regal purple-blue hues with sparkling white eyes. A compact mound of deeply cut foliage forms around the exquisite, elegant flower spikes. Blooms early to late summer in full sun to mostly sun.	H 30-35" W 18-23" Zone 3	
<i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'Guardian Blue'</b> Delphinium	Mid-sized perennial with sturdy flower spikes densely packed with double, rich dark-blue florets adorned with white bees. Blooms for weeks from early to mid summer.	H 30-39" W 10-12" Zone 4	
<i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'King Arthur'</b> Delphinium	Long life span as vase flowers. Royal violet-purple blooms cluster in handsome florets in the summertime. Perfect border flower. Prefers full sun. Attracts pollinators.	H 4' W 18-24" Zone 3

<i>Delphinium elatum</i> <b>'Purple Passion'</b> Delphinium (Hybrid Bee)	Densely packed spikes of deep purple and white bee flowers. Strong, tall stems hold these well above the ground and its divided dark-green mounded foliage. Compact habit provides a neat appearance. Likes full or partial sun and fertile, moist, but well-drained soils. Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds, not liked by deer and rabbits.	H 4-5' W 18-24" Zone 3	 <p>credit: Walters Gardens, Inc</p>
<i>Dianthus</i> <b>PRETTY POPPERS®</b> <b>'Cute as a Button'</b>	Semi-double, light pink flowers blossom in the early summer. Serrated edges of the petals and a deep red eye give this flower a little flare. Foliage is blue green. Does well in full sun to partial shade. Fragrant, attracts butterflies and pollinators.	H 6-8" W 14" Zone 4	
<i>Dianthus</i> <b>PRETTY POPPERS®</b> <b>'Electric Red'</b>	This plant grabs your attention with its dramatic red color, serrated edges, and contrasting blue green foliage. Excellent for an accent piece, containers, edging, fragrant flowers, mass planting, etc. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early summer to early fall.	H 8-10" W 16" Zone 4	
<i>Dianthus</i> <b>PRETTY POPPERS®</b> <b>'Goody Gumdrops'</b>	Semi-double, fuchsia pink flowers with a red center. Foliage is blue green. Fragrant, deer resistant, attractive to butterflies and pollinators. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early summer to early fall.	H 8-10" W 16-18" Zone 4

<i>Dianthus barbatus</i> <b>'Scarlet Fever'</b> Perennial Sweet William	Large panicles of bright orange-red flowers. Green lanceolate leaves run the length of the stalk. More characteristic of a true perennial than typical <i>Dianthus</i> . Blooms early summer to early fall. Suitable for containers. Fragrant, attracts butterflies and pollinators. <i>Dicentra spectabilis</i> Pink Bleeding Heart	Forms a large mass of fresh green leaves topped with arching sprays of large, puffy, heart-shaped, rose-pink flowers with white tips. May go summer dormant in some climates.	H 30-36" W 30-36" Zone 3	
<i>Dicentra spectabilis</i> <b>'Alba'</b> White Bleeding Heart	White heart-shaped flowers and lime-green foliage. Tall stems emerge and produce dangling clusters of blossoms in early spring. Repeat bloom is likely in cooler autumn weather. Spreads into large clumps when planted in loose, moist soil.	H 3' W 3' Zone 3	
<i>Dicentra spectabilis</i> <b>'Valentine®'</b> <b>PP22739</b> Bleeding Heart	Graceful perennial producing dozens of arching flower stems adorned with dangling, heart-shaped, rich scarlet-red flowers with protruding white petals. Great for shaded borders or woodland gardens.	H 1-2' W 1-2' Zone 3	
<i>Echinacea</i> <b>Butterfly™</b> <b>'Cleopatra'</b> <b>PP24631</b> Coneflower	Fast growing, fragrant, saturated yellow flowers in a compact form. Attracts butterflies and pollinators. Suitable for patio pots. Likes full sun and does not need much water once matured. Blooms from summer into the fall.	H 15-18" W 18-24" Zone 4

<i>Echinacea</i> <b>COLOR CODED®</b> <b>'Orange You Awesome'</b> <b>PP32105</b> Coneflower	Tangerine orange flowers with a slight magenta halo near the cone. Compact, upright habit with green foliage. Blooms in midsummer to late summer. Attracts butterflies and pollinators, deer do not prefer. Plant in full to partial sun. Can be used as a cut flower. <i>Echinacea</i> <b>Cone-Fections™</b> <b>'Sweet Chili'</b> Coneflower	Fully double-flower, vivid paprika orange pom-pom flowers on sturdy stems. Compact form works well with container planting. Attracts butterflies. Likes full sun and does not need much water once matured. Blooms from early summer to early fall.	H 2' W 18-24" Zone 4	
<i>Echinacea</i> <b>DOUBLE SCOOP™</b> <b>'Cranberry'</b> Coneflower	Large non-fading cranberry-red double flower with central, small petals pompom and large drooping outer petals. Well branched, sturdy, and upright habit. Dark green foliage. Blooms early summer into the fall. Excellent as cut flowers, in a perennial border, or prairies. Likes full sun and low to average water requirements.	H 1-2' W 1-2' Zone 4	
<i>Echinacea purpurea</i> <b>'Green Twister'</b> Purple Coneflower	Mounding habit of deep green foliage hosts sturdy, upright protruding stems. Each is topped with a bicolor radial banding flower, outer pistachio green tips transition to lilac pink, a dark red to rust colored cone rests in the center. Likes full sun and low to average water requirements.	H 2-3' W 18-24" Zone 4	
<i>Echinacea</i> <b>Kismet®</b> <b>'Intense Orange'</b> Coneflower	Lively tangerine orange flowers. Blooms from early summer until frost occurs. Nativar.	H 18" W 18-24" Zone 4

<i>Echinacea</i> <b>'Lovely Lolly'</b> Coneflower	Upright, deep pink petal profusion, fully double coneflower on purple stems. Blooms occur from early summer through late October. Full sun but tolerates some shade when established. Prefers well-draining soil with organic content, allow to dry between waterings. Great for use in garden, containers and as cut flowers. <i>Echinacea</i> <b>'Moab Sunset'</b> Coneflower	A semi-double coneflower producing non-stop blooms in the brightest of oranges and orange reds from summer to frost. This color is beyond intense and not to be planted by roadsides to avoid distracting drivers while they text about this plant.	H 24-26" W 18-24" Zone 3	
<i>Echinacea</i> <b>Butterfly™</b> <b>'Postman™'</b> <b>PP28524</b> Coneflower	Deep orange-red flowers. Fragrant, fast growing, and works well with containers. Attractive to butterflies and pollinators. Full sun.	H 15-18" W 18-24" Zone 4	
<i>Echinacea</i> <b>Butterfly™</b> <b>'Purple Emperor'</b> <b>PP24459</b> Coneflower	Magenta purple flowers. Fragrant, fast growing, and works well with containers. Attractive to butterflies and pollinators. Full sun.	H 15-18" W 18-24" Zone 4

<i>Echinacea</i> <b>'Sweet Sandia'</b> Coneflower	Petals transition from deep pink to pale green in radial banding. Fragrant, attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and pollinators. Blooms midsummer and until fall frost. Deer resistant. Plant in full sun and average, well-drained, dry to medium moisture soils.	H 19" W 16" Zone 4	
<i>Echinacea purpurea</i> <b>PowWow®</b> <b>White</b> Coneflower	Satin white flowers with gold cones, petals arch downwards. It is well branched with sturdy stocks to hold the flowers upright. Blooms from early summer into the fall. Best performance in full sun and dry to medium moisture soil. Drought and heat tolerant. <i>Echinacea purpurea</i> <b>PowWow®</b> <b>Wild Berry</b> Coneflower	Non-fading dark red-purple flowers, petals arch downwards. It is well branched with sturdy stocks to hold the flowers upright. Blooms from early summer into the fall. Best performance in full sun and dry to medium moisture soil. Drought and heat tolerant.	H 18-24" W 12-16" Zone 4	
<i>Echinops ritro</i> <b>'Veitch's Blue'</b> Globe Thistle	An ornamental thistle with unusual blue tones, yet uniquely attractive. Spiky globes with dark blue centers, transition in hue towards the spike tips, providing an all-around steel-blue starburst appearance. Blooms early to late summer. Grey stems support the globes along with spiny, grey green, pinnately lobed foliage down to the base. Grow in full sun and any soil that is not soggy.	H 30-36" W 20-24" Zone 3	
<i>Eremurus stenophyllus</i> Foxtail Lily	Dense spikes of yellow star-shaped flowers that bloom early to midsummer. Blooms begin at the spike bottom and progress to the top. Long, thin leaves wither during blooming, so combine with a ground cover plant. Needs full sun and rich, well-drained soils. Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds.	H 6-8' W 1-2' Zone 5
