<i>Achillea tomentosa</i> 'Goldie' Yarrow	Low-growing, flat-headed large golden flowers. Sun to part shade. Deer resistant. Attracts butterflies. Cut back after flowering.	H 3-6" W 8" Zone 3	
<i>Aegopodium podagraria</i> 'Variegatum' Snow on the Mountain or Bishop's Goutweed	Dense canopy of green variegated foliage. Small white flowers in midsummer upon leafy stems up to three feet tall. Full sun to part shade. Average soil requirements.	H 8-24" W 12-72" Zone 4

<i>Allium</i> 'Lavender Bubbles' Ornamental Onion	This allium features dark, dusty purple globe-shaped flowers. Glossy green-blue foliage clusters nicely below the flowers. As the blades grow, they tend to curl, adding dimension to this unique variety. Prefers full sun or partial shade, low to average water needs. Compatible with containers. <i>Aquilegia</i> KIRIGAMI™ Deep Blue & White Columbine	Thin, green upright stems support upward-facing flowers of dark indigo blue and white shades. Blooms from late spring to early summer. <i>Aubrieta</i> AXCENT™ 'Red Cascade' Rock Cress	Compact, mat-forming, evergreen perennial with small gray-green leaves and short four-petal, deep red flowers in spring. <i>Baptisia hybrida</i> 'American Goldfinch' False Indigo	Very floriferous, producing loads of brightly colored spikes. Produces round seed pods in the fall. Requires minimal maintenance. Deer resistant. Full sun to part shade. Prefers light sandy soil.	H 36-42" W 54-60" Zone 4

<i>Baptisia</i> 'Indigo Spires' False Indigo	A densely branched, fully rounded clump of glaucous green foliage that extends far down the stems, leaving little bare stem showing at the base. In early summer, 12-15" long spikes of deep violet purple flowers accented by a yellow keel are borne on all sides of the rounded clump. Flower spikes extend the flowering time into midsummer. <i>Baptisia</i> 'Plum Rosy' False Indigo	A beautifully elegant bicolor Baptisia that bursts onto the scene in late spring to early summer. Newest flowers open mauve pink and lighten to near white with age. Both flower colors are present on the stem for a beautiful bicolor effect. Full sun to part shade. Prefers light sandy soil. <i>Baptisia</i> 'Royal Purple' False Indigo	Dark violet purple blooms saturated with color. Dramatic flower spikes with appealing visual display. Full sun to part shade. Prefers light sandy soil.	H 3-4' W 3-4' Zone 4	
<i>Baptisia</i> 'TWILITE PRAIRIE BLUES™' False Indigo	Deep purple buds open to smokey violet flowers with lemon yellow keels. Long-lasting flowers appear on upright spikes from late spring to early summer. Full sun to part shade. Prefers light sandy soil.	H 42-60" W 4-5' Zone 4	
<i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> 'Sakura'	Pink, semi-double flowers float above a mound of compact, glossy foliage that turns plum purple in winter. This hardy evergreen lends itself to mass plantings, containers, and border fronts with extremely little maintenance. Deer resistant. Full sun to part shade. Prefers average to well-drained soil. <i>Bergenia cordifolia</i> 'Spring Fling'	A large, tight, upright plant with magenta-pink flowers that bloom heavily. Foliage turns gorgeous, satiny purple black in the fall and winter. Deer resistant. Full sun to part shade. Prefers average to well-drained soil.	H 12" W 12" Zone 4

<i>Brunnera macrophylla</i> 'Jack of Diamond' False Forget-Me-Not	This shade perennial is a giant version of the classic 'Jack Frost' - with a twist. The huge 9-10" leaves have a heavy silver overlay with vivid wide, dark green veining pattern. Blue flower is spring. Consistent moist soil is preferred. Deer resistant. <i>Certastium tomentosum</i> 'Yoyo' Snow in Summer	Flowering is profuse, with blooms that are silvery white, and star shaped. Showy, silver, gray-green foliage creates an attractive ground cover. Does well in poor soil but needs full sun. Blooms late spring to early summer.	H 4-6" W 12-15" Zone 3	
<i>Chelone lyonii</i> 'Hot Lips' Turtlehead	Shiny green leaves topped with pink turtle-shaped flowers in late summer and early fall. Adaptable to most types of soil that stay medium moist or wet. Attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Deer resistant. Full sun to part shade.	H 10-12" W 12-18" Zone 3

<i>Chrysanthemum</i> 'Mammoth Yellow Quill' Daisy Mum	Semi-double, bright yellow flowers with unique spoon-shaped ray florets. Blooms late summer. Hardy, vigorous, and grows to a mammoth size. Prefers well drained soil.	H 14" W 20" Zone 3	
<i>Bush clematis</i> "Rain Dance"	A beautiful bush clematis with large (2½-3"), outward facing indigo blue flowers that have darker midribs and lighter margins. This is a non-vining clematis that benefits from support. Can live in flexible soil quality, full or part sun, and average water requirements. Different variation of below. <i>Bush clematis</i> "Stand By Me Pink"	Completely herbaceous and will restart from the ground each year. A compact mound of deeply cut foliage forms around the exquisite, elegant flower spikes. Blooms early to late summer in full sun to mostly sun. Average water needs.	H 30-35" W 18-23" Zone 3	
<i>Delphinium elatum</i> 'Guardian Blue' Delphinium	Mid-sized perennial with sturdy flower spikes densely packed with double, rich dark-blue florets adorned with white bees. Blooms for weeks from early to mid summer. Full sun to part shade. Prefers rich, well-drained soil.	H 30-39" W 10-12" Zone 4	
<i>Delphinium elatum</i> 'King Arthur' Delphinium	Long life span as vase flowers. Royal violet-purple blooms cluster in handsome florets in the summertime. Perfect border flower. Prefers full sun. Attracts pollinators. Prefers rich, well-drained soil.	H 4' W 18-24" Zone 3

Evergreen in warmer winter climate areas and may have trouble returning in wet winter areas. Tolerant of heat, moderately salt-tolerant, and very drought-tolerant. Dormant in summer in our climate. Deer and rabbit resistant. Attracts butterflies. Morning sun or shade. Prefers well-drained soil.	H 30-36" W 30-36" Zone 3	
<i>Dicentra spectabilis</i> 'Alba' White Bleeding Heart	White heart-shaped flowers and lime-green foliage. Tall stems emerge and produce dangling clusters of blossoms in early spring. Repeat bloom is likely in cooler autumn weather. Spreads into large clumps when planted in loose, moist soil. Deer and rabbit resistant. Attracts butterflies. Morning sun or shade. <i>Dicentra spectabilis</i> 'Valentine®' Bleeding Heart	Graceful arching flower stems adorned with dangling, heart-shaped, rich scarlet-red flowers with protruding white petals. <i>Digitalis purpurea</i> 'Candy Mountain Rose' Foxglove	The first foxglove ever has upward-facing flowers instead of the usual downward-facing ones, easily showing the beautifully speckled throats of these rose-pink blossoms.
