<i>Berberis thunbergia</i> 'Orange Rocket' Barberry	Compact, upright, thorny deciduous shrub with orange-red new foliage that matures to green in the summer. Leaves transition to a vibrant red in the fall. Petite pale-yellow flowers show up early summer. Many small crimson-red berries appear in the fall, outlasting the foliage. Rust resistant. <i>Berberis</i> 'Sunjoy Gold Pillar' Barberry	Gold leaves with terrific density and brilliant shades of red and orange foliage in spring. Very upright almost vertical branches.	H 3-4' W 18" Zone 4	 Photo credit: Proven Winners
<i>Caragana arborescens</i> Caragana	Bright yellow flowers from May to June. Hardy and drought resistant. Great as a hedge. Xeriscape plant.	H 12-15' W 8-10' Zone 2	 
<i>Caragana frutex</i> Globe caragana	Compact. Dark green leaves with small yellow flowers. Slow grower with uniform shape and occasional yellow flowers in summer. Good as a formal hedge or small specimen. A non-suckering type.	H 2-3' W 2-3' Zone 3	
<i>Cornus alba bailhalo</i> 'Ivory Halo' Dogwood	Flat clusters of white flowers bloom Late Spring, followed by small white berries in fall. Medium green foliage with white edges in compact habit. Showy red twigs in winter.	H 6-8' W 6-8' Zone 3

<i>Cotinus coggygia</i> Winecraft Gold Spirit Dwarf® Smokebush	The Golden Spirit Smokebush is a popular choice for gardeners looking to add vibrant color and interest to their landscape. Features bright golden-yellow leaves that retain their color throughout the growing season and fluffy, smoke-like flower clusters in summer. <i>Cotoneaster lucidus</i> Hedge Cotoneaster	Upright and rounding habit. Small pink flowers bloom from late spring to early summer. Small berries replace them and persist into winter. Leaves are thick, shiny, and dark green, and have orange-red color in the fall. Perfect pruning into a variety of shapes. Plant in full sun to partial shade.	H 6-10' W 6-8' Zone 3	
<i>Daphne burkwoodii</i> 'Carol Mackie' Daphne	Small, fragrant, pink blossoms and variegated foliage. Quite easy to grow, requires cool, dry, well-drained soil. Prefers shaded north or east side.	H 2-4' W 2-4' Zone 4

'Diervilla' First Editions Cool Splash Bush Honeysuckle	Easily grown in average, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade. Tolerates some drought. Wide range of soil tolerance. <i>Forsythia</i> 'Meadowlark' Meadowlark Forsythia	A shrub with superior flower-bud hardiness and showy, bright yellow spring flowers, its flower buds are hardy to -35°F. It will perform best in full sun.	H 8-10' W 6-10' Zone 3	
<i>Hydrangea arborescens</i> 'Annabelle' Hydrangea	Covered with spectacular snowball-shaped flower clusters ranging in size from 6-12" across. Ideal for use in hedging and cut flowers. <i>Hydrangea arborescens</i> 'Endless Summer Crush' Hydrangea	Intense, reblooming, deep raspberry red or neon purple spectacular flower clusters.	H 4' W 4' Zone 3	
<i>Hydrangea arborescens</i> Flower Full™ Hydrangea	Produces two-to-three times more blooms per season than others. Features strong stems that don't flop in the wind and rain, holding the bold blooms tall all season. Ideal for smaller landscapes where traditional panicle hydrangeas won't fit. As temperatures drop in the fall, the petals turn antique shades of white and pink. <i>Hydrangea paniculata</i> 'Renhy' Vanilla Strawberry Hydrangea Regular and grafted available	Stunning large blooms start white, then turn pink in the center, which spreads across the bloom into fall. Cool weather triggers color show! Cascading habit as flowers grow large on red-tinted stems.	H 6-8' W 4-5' Zone 3	
<i>Ilex verticillata</i> Berry Heavy Winterberry Holly	Produces copious amounts of bright red berries that shine in the fall and winter landscape. A deciduous holly, berries are not edible for humans but are relished by birds after they've softened in mid-winter. Native to North America. Requires a male pollinator to produce berries. <i>Ilex verticillata</i> 'FARROWMRP' Mr. Poppins® Winterberry Holly	The early blooming male companion winterberry for Berry Heavy®. Compact habit and deciduous lush green foliage. Small white flowers attract bees which pollinate nearby females. Can pollinate up to 5 female plants, needs to be within 50'. Adaptable to wet soil. Prefers wind protection and partial-sun locations. <i>Lonicera tatarica</i> 'Arnold Red' Honeysuckle	The darkest of red honeysuckles, with an upright, arching form and bright berries. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies. Resistant to honeysuckle aphid. Full sun.	H 6-8' W 4-6' Zone 3	
<i>Philadelphus</i> 'Snow White Fantasy' Mock Orange	Repeat-flowering, 2-inch double flowers in clusters that bloom abundantly in spring and then again in summer. A versatile shrub with pure white, deliciously fragrant flowers.	H 4-5' W 4-5' Zone 4	
<i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i> 'Amber Jubilee' Ninebark	Orange, yellow and gold foliage. Delicate white blooms produced in spring, and fall foliage highlighted with tones of red and purple, making this ninebark appealing over the entire season. Plant in full sun for best performance. <i>Potentilla fruticosa</i> 'Crème Brulée' Potentilla	Long bloom time, exceptional hardiness, and low maintenance. Stands up to drought, air pollution, and salt, and tolerates a wide range of growing conditions. Plants can get sparse without 6 or more hours of sunlight. <i>Potentilla fruticosa</i> 'Goldfinger' Potentilla	Flowers look like big, yellow buttercups. Deep green foliage, deciduous shrub. Recommended for compact shape and showy flower display. All-summer color. Plant in full or partial sun, not fussy about soil if well-drained. Xeriscape plant.	H 3' W 3' Zone 2

<i>Potentilla fruticosa</i> 'Red Robin' Potentilla	Compact, dwarf shrub with a vigorous, rounded habit. Bright red to brick-red blooms from spring to frost. Used for specimen or low hedge. <i>Ribes alpinum</i> Alpine Currant	A compact, dense shrub growing with inconspicuous yellow flowers in June. <i>Spirea japonica</i> 'Neon Flash' Spirea	A newer Spiraea cultivar with a vigorous growth habit. Covered with bright cherry red flower clusters throughout the growing season. New growth has a tinge of purple before turning green. Sun or full shade.	H 2-3' W 2-3' Zone 3	
Spirea bet Tor Birch leaf Spirea	In summer, small flat white flower clusters cover branches with dark green leaves. In fall, leaves turn gold, red, and purple. Compact, rounded, and deciduous. Full sun, and likes medium moisture, well-drained soil.	H 2-3' W 2-3' Zone 3	Photo Credit: 
<i>Spirea x vanhouttei</i> 'Renaissance' or 'Bridal Wreath' Spirea	A fountain-like growth pattern with beautifully arching stems. Showered with clusters of small, white flowers in mid-spring. Foliage has superior disease resistance. Prune before it blooms. Orange red in fall.	H 5-7' W 6-8' Zone 3

<p><i>Syringa vulgaris</i> Madame Lemoine</p>	<p>Madame Lemoine Lilac has double white flowers with tiny yellow centers, making this French lilac cultivar one classy addition to any landscape. It has a lovely shape and is medium-sized. A nice, wide spreader with great fragrance! <i>Syringa bailbridget</i> 'Virtual Violet' Lilac	Shiny violet-trimmed new leaves, deep purple stems, raspberry-purple buds, and fragrant violet flowers.
