<p><i>Aronia melanocarpa</i> 'UCONNAM165' Low Scape Mound® PP31821 Black Chokeberry</p>	<p>A compact, low-mounded variety with glossy, dark green leaves and showy white flowers in spring. A great choice for edging, groundcover, or bank stabilizing. Brilliant red foliage in fall contrasts with the dark purple-black fruit. <p><i>Berberis thunbergia</i> <i>f. atropurpurea</i> 'Admiration' PP16921 Japanese Barberry</p>	<p>Compact habit and deciduous dwarf shrub. New growth foliage transitions from green to coral-red with a thin golden-yellow outer margin. In the fall, the red deepens to maroon. Likes full sun to partial shade. Plant is not sensitive to soil type, but it must drain and not be soggy. <p><i>Berberis thunbergia</i> 'Golden Rocket' PP18626 Japanese Barberry</p>	<p>Compact and upright deciduous shrub with chartreuse foliage, coral-red stems. A small thorn develops with each leaf axil. Miniature pale-yellow flowers show in the spring. Small luminous crimson-red berries populate the shrub in the fall, outlasting the leaves. Likes full sun to partial shade. Plant is not sensitive to soil type, but it must drain and not be soggy. <p><i>Berberis thunbergia</i> 'Orange Rocket' PP18411 Japanese Barberry</p>	<p>Compact, upright, thorny deciduous shrub with orange-red new foliage that matures to green in the summer. Leaves transition to a vibrant red in the fall. Petite pale-yellow flowers show in early summer. Many small crimson-red berries appear in the fall, outlasting the foliage. 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<p><i>Caragana arborescens</i> caragana</p>	<p>Bright yellow flowers from May to June. Hardy and drought resistant. Great as a hedge. Xeriscape plant.</p>	<p>H 12-15' W 10' Zone 2</p>	
<p><i>Caragana arborescens</i> Walker Weeping caragana</p>	<p>Small, deciduous tree or shrub with weeping growth habit. Finely cut, bright green foliage gives a fern-like appearance. Easy to grow and very cold hardy.</p>	<p>H 5' W 3-5' Zone 2</p>	
<p><i>Caragana frutex</i> Globe caragana</p>	<p>Dark green, egg-shaped leaves that become yellow in fall. Slow grower with uniform shape and occasional yellow flowers in summer.</p>	<p>H 24-36" W 24-36" Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Cornus alba</i> 'Argenteo-Marginata' Euro. Variegated Dogwood</p>	<p>Variegated form of red twigged dogwood. Leaves are edged with an uneven margin of creamy white. Stems are beautiful combined with evergreens for winter interest.</p>	<p>H 6-8' W 8-10' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Cornus stolonifera</i> 'Farrow' Arctic Fire® PP18523 Red Osier Dogwood</p>	<p>Compact, dwarf variety. Bright red stems stand out in the winter. Ideal for gardens and landscaping, where size is a concern. One of the most shade tolerant ornamental shrubs. Also suitable for various soil conditions.</p>	<p>H 36-60" W 36-60" Zone 2</p>

<p><i>Cotinus coggygria</i> 'NCC01' Winecraft Black® PP30216 Smokebush</p>	<p>Compact, rounded habit. Deep purple-black leaves progressively darken into summer. In midsummer, large airy smoke-like blooms add significant volume to the profile, completely engulfing the plant. Fall weather transforms the deciduous foliage to vibrant oranges and reds. Plant in full sun, likes dry to moist soils.</p>	<p>H 4-6' W 4-6' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Cotoneaster lucidus</i> Hedge</p>	<p>Upright and rounding habit. Small pink flowers bloom in late spring to early summer. Small berries replace them and persist into winter. Green foliage changes to reds and yellow in the fall. Perfect pruning into a variety of shapes. Plant in full sun to partial shade.</p>	<p>H 6-10' W 6-10' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Daphne burkwoodii</i> 'Carol Mackie' Daphne</p>	<p>Small, pale pink, fragrant blossoms cloak small leaves with yellow margins. Matures to a creamy white color. Very easy to grow in drier fertile soils.</p>	<p>H 3' W 4' Zone 4+</p>	
<p><i>Euonymus alatus</i> 'Compactus' Dwarf Burning Bush</p>	<p>Compact, deciduous, spreading shrub. In late spring small green flowers appear amongst the green foliage before small fruit develop. In autumn, the fruit split open and foliage turns brilliant scarlet-red and droops. Grows in full to partial sun and average, well-drained soils.</p>	<p>H 8' W 8' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Hydrangea arborescens</i> 'Annabelle' Snowball Hydrangea</p>	<p>Large snowball-shaped flower clusters ranging in size from 6-12" across. Flowers start as light green and mature to white. Ideal for use in hedging and as a source for cut flowers. Blooms early summer into late summer.</p>	<p>H 3-6' W 4-6' Zone 3</p>

<p><i>Hydrangea paniculata</i> 'ILVOBO' BoBo® PP22782 Panicle Hydrangea</p>	<p>Profuse amounts of large white flowers appear mid to late summer. Blooms are held upright on strong stems. Unique, compact habit makes it a must-have plant for any small garden. Likes full to partial sun.</p>	<p>H 30-36" W 3-4' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Hydrangea paniculata</i> Bombshell Hydrangea</p>	<p>Smothered in white flowers against dark green foliage from summer until frost. Dwarf growth habit.</p>	<p>H 2-3' W 3-4' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Hydrangea paniculata</i> 'SMHPFL' Fire Light® PP25135 Panicle Hydrangea (Tree Form)</p>	<p>Huge flower heads from midsummer to fall. Blossoms begin as a creamy-white and gradually mature to raspberry-pink. Makes great cut flowers. Tree form elevates the flowers and foliage well above ground level. Plant in full to partial sun and humus-rich, moist, well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 4-5' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Hydrangea paniculata</i> 'Renhy' Vanilla Strawberry PP20670 Panicle Hydrangea (Grafted)</p>	<p>Stunning large blooms start white, then turn pink in the center, which spreads across the bloom into fall. Cool weather starts the color show! Cascading habit as flowers grow large on red-tinted stems.</p>	<p>H 6-8' W 4-5' Zone 3</p>

<p><i>Ilex verticillata</i> 'FARROWBPOP' Berry Poppins® PP25835 Winterberry Holly</p>	<p>Produces small greenish-white flower in late spring to early summer. An abundance of bright-red berries replaces the flowers and last through fall and winter unless eaten by birds. Toothed, glossy dark-green leaves adorn this dwarf shrub in the warmer months. <p><i>Ilex verticillata</i> 'FARROWMRP' Mr. Poppins® PP25834 Winterberry Holly</p>	<p>The early blooming male companion winterberry for Berry Poppins®. Compact habit and deciduous lush green foliage. Small white flowers attract bees which pollinate nearby females. Can pollinate up to 5 female plants, needs to be within 50'. Adaptable to wet soils. <p><i>Lonicera tatarica</i> 'Arnold Red' Honeysuckle</p>	<p>The darkest of the red honeysuckles, with an upright, arching form and bright berries. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies. Resistant to honeysuckle aphid. Full sun.</p>	<p>H 6-8' W 4-6' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Philadelphus</i> 'Snow White Fantasy' Mock Orange</p>	<p>A repeat-flowering hybrid, Snow White™ boasts 2-inch double flowers borne in clusters that bloom abundantly in spring and then again in summer. A versatile shrub with pure white, deliciously fragrant flowers.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 4-5' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Philadelphus</i> 'Snowbelle' Mock Orange</p>	<p>This shrub is easily grown in medium moisture, well-drained soil, and prefers full sun to light shade. Flowers appear on prior year's growth, so prune after flowering. Excellent heat and cold tolerance.</p>	<p>H 3-4' W 3-4' Zone 4</p>	

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<p><i>Philadelphus lewisii</i> 'Blizzard' Mock Orange</p>	<p>Covered with profuse clusters of fragrant, single white blooms lasting up to 4 weeks. Selected for winter hardiness. Sun or full shade. Prune after blooming. Xeriscape.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 4-5' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i> 'Hoogi021' Little Joker® PP27986 Ninebark</p>	<p>Deciduous, full branching dwarf shrub with burgundy foliage and stems. Leaves have a deep-green undertones. Pale-pink flowers bloom in spring and summer. Likes sun to partial shade and moist soil.</p>	<p>H 2' W 1' Zone 3</p>	 <p><small>credit: Eshraghi Nursery LLC</small> <small>Unlicensed propagation prohibited</small></p>
<p><i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i> 'ZLEBic5' Sweet Cherry Tea™ PP31235 Ninebark</p>	<p>The first re-blooming ninebark. Soft-pink flowers bloom in spring and repeat mid-summer followed by warm, reddish-orange new growth. Exceptional branching coupled with the colorful new growth. Rose-red fruit replace the flowers in late spring. Plant in full sun with average, moist, but well-drained soil.</p>	<p>H 4' W 4' Zone 3</p>	 <p><small>Unlicensed propagation prohibited</small></p>
<p><i>Potentilla fruticosa</i> 'Goldfinger' Shrubby Cinquefoil</p>	<p>Flowers look like big, yellow buttercups. Deep green foliage, deciduous shrub. Recommended for compact shape and showy flower display. Adds all-summer color to shrub and perennial border. Plant in full or partial sun, not picky about soils if well-drained.</p>	<p>H 3' W 3-4' Zone 2</p>

<p><i>Prunus x cisterna</i> 'Purpleleaf Sand' Cherry</p>	<p>Deciduous, purplish leaf color in the summer. Fragrant pink and white flower bloom in the spring that give way to bird attractant berries in the summer. Plant in full sun where it performs best, can tolerate some shade. Provide moist, loam-rich, well-drained soils when choosing a location.</p>	<p>H 7-10' W 5-8' Zone 2a</p>	
<p><i>Rhododendron</i> 'Electric Lights Red' Azalea</p>	<p>Solid fire-engine-red blossoms. Blooms with fervent energy that lasts and lasts. Ruffled petals lay on a bed of bright green leaves that create an eye-catching contrast. Prefers a sheltered north or east side.</p>	<p>H 4-5' W 4-5' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Spiraea japonica</i> 'Walbuma' Magic Carpet™ Japanese Spirea</p>	<p>Fast growing, compact, mounding shrub. Long-lasting, lilac pink flowers bloom in clusters and will often re-bloom. New foliage is reddish orange, turning yellow-gold and finally fiery orange. Plant in full or partial sun.</p>	<p>H 18" W 2' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Spiraea x vanhouttei</i> 'Renaissance' or 'Bridal Wreath' Spirea</p>	<p>A fountain-like growth pattern with beautifully arching stems. Showered with clusters of small, white flowers in mid-spring. Foliage has superior disease resistance. Orange red in fall.</p>	<p>H 5-7' W 6-8' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Syringa vulgaris</i> Common Purple Lilac</p>	<p>Fast growing, flowering shrub with attractive foliage. Large clusters of fragrant, lavender-purple blooms in spring. Showy hedge or screen.</p>	<p>H 12-15' W 8-12' Zone 2</p>	

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<p><i>Syringa vulgaris</i> Krasavitsa Moskovy 'Beauty of Moscow' Lilac</p>	<p>Flowers abundantly with delicate, double pink blooms. Nostalgic shrub with fragrant blossoms. Best used in shrub border, as a hedge, or as a screen.</p>	<p>H 10-12' W 8' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Syringa vulgaris</i> 'Bloomerang' Dark Purple Lilac</p>	<p>A classic dwarf lilac that blooms in spring and reblooms in mid-summer through fall. A beautiful dark purple with larger and more rounded flowers.</p>	<p>H 4-6' W 4-6' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Syringa vulgaris</i> 'Sensation' Lilac</p>	<p>Upright, flowering shrub with a rounded form. Unique clusters of fragrant purple flowers edged in white.</p>	<p>H 8-10' W 8-12' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Syringa vulgaris</i> 'Yankee Doodle' Lilac</p>	<p>One of the deepest and darkest of all purple lilacs. Very fragrant blossoms. Excellent hedge or border plant. Easy to grow.</p>	<p>H 8' W 8' Zone 3</p>	
<p><i>Syringa x prestoniae</i> 'Miss Canada' Lilac</p>	<p>The brightest pink of all the lilacs. Single flower, vigorous, and non-suckering. Foliage is larger than other lilacs. Extremely hardy.</p>	<p>H 6-9' W 5-8' Zone 2</p>	

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<p><i>Weigela florida</i> 'Red Prince' Weigela</p>	<p>Displays non-fading, rich red flowers above fresh green foliage. Excellent re-blooming qualities. Upright, arching branches.</p>	<p>H 5-6' W 5-6' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Yucca filamentosa</i> 'Ivory Tower' Adam's Needle</p>	<p>A large spike of ivory flowers towers above a rosette of sword-like, dark blue-green foliage, that colorizes as it matures. Performs best in full sun but will tolerate partial shade. Can grow in very poor soils, it is drought and heat tolerant too.</p>	<p>H 3' W 4' Zone 4</p>	
<p><i>Yucca filamentosa</i> Color Guard Yucca</p>	<p>Variegated leaves have a pink tinge and yellow stripe with a rosy hue in cool weather. Fragrant snow white flower spikes in midsummer.</p>	<p>H 3-3.5' W 2-3' Zone 4</p>
